Greetings to our extended family,

So much has changed in our world over the last year, but the comfort and healing found in loving family remains steadfast. That is the prime reason for the resilience of our children, families and the organisation.

At Home from Home we have been well supported in meeting the challenges that Covid 19 has faced us with in this first year. However, after realising the extended nature of the pandemic, we anticipated the economic impact that would follow down the line.

The Department of Social Development (DSD) has predicted that 25% of the NGO sector may be forced to close their doors. These economic repercussions started to happen quite significantly for Home from Home during the latter half of last year. Some donors have had to reduce or withdraw their funding due to economic pressures. Most recently, in March, we received news that our most significant annual donor, who has supported us since our inception, 16 years ago, has had to close their doors.

In light of this, we have had to be innovative in our fundraising efforts and we are delighted to have been selected as one of three beneficiaries for the Cableway Charity Challenge this year. (Read all about it below)

Also, our Orange Art Project pioneered by well-known artist, Jill Trappler was an incredibly successful and rewarding initiative during Lockdown last year and culminated in a delightful exhibition at a gallery in the city centre. (Read below)


We need to continuously look for new ways to fund the core of our business - our 36 Loving Family Foster Homes which support the almost 200 vulnerable children in our care.

### ORANGE ART PROJECT

The Orange Art Project, a unique exhibition of colourful artwork took place in February at the Spin Street Gallery in Cape Town. It was open to the public and received much attention both locally and abroad.

This pilot project was the brainchild of Jill Trappler, who encouraged 8 artists to assist her by initially introducing the joy of the creative arts to 6 of our foster homes. It soon grew to 12 homes as the enthusiasm spread! The plan is to raise additional funds to continue and grow the project this year.

### The average monthly costs per house (with six children) include:

- Education: R1 900 (school fees, school transport, stationery, uniform and tutoring)
- Children's development: R1 700 (therapy, medical treatment and workshops/sessions)
- Housekeeping: R6 800 (water, electricity, rates, rent, groceries, repairs and maintenance)
- Staff costs: R9 300 (salary/wages, training and welfare)
- Computer connectivity: R1 450 (data and IT support)
